## July 1848

My name is Charles Isaac, I am 61 years old and I am the blacksmith at Foxham<sup>1</sup>. My son, he's also called Charles, works with me and will one day take over the business.

A lot of my work comes from the farms, I make the metal fittings to mend carts and metal tyres for wheels. I am always being asked to repair or make ploughshares. A big stone can easily break a plough, the ploughmen aren't very careful you see, although they would tell you the stones are hidden. Then of course I am kept busy making shoes for horses.

My forge is just along from the lower lock at Foxham<sup>2</sup>. The canal boats pass by regularly, quite often the steerers come to see me as their boat horse has thrown a shoe.

Since the canal was opened (1810) for regular traffic the canal company have come to me when they are repairing locks and bridges<sup>3</sup>. I have fashioned all sorts of metal pieces, from winding gear for lock gates to straps for bridges, I make tools as well.

There is enough work in Foxham for two Blacksmiths, Tom Hayden is a blacksmith just down the road. He doesn't do any canal work though<sup>4</sup>, the farms keep him busy.

William Hodgeson, the carpenter at Pewsham comes to see me and tells what he needs me to make for the canal company. Last month I made some new handrails for the top lock gates at Pewsham. When they were ready Mr Hodgeson arranged for a boat to take them down to Pewsham, where he fitted them to the gates.

I do go down to Pewsham sometimes to see what is needed, Pewsham has a dry dock and they are always busy repairing boats. I make all the metal parts for the boats, right down to the nails and hinges.
